-The Washington Wild Things Advanced Baseball Camp provides tremendous individual attention from professional athletes to players devoted to learning and improving their game. This camp will focus on specific skills for every position, including:

- Proper fielding techniques
- Pitching mechanics breakdown
- Swing analysis

-Campers will be drilled and practice the techniques in a combination setting. Each Sunday a different set of specific positions will be covered based on the needs of the individual players.

Where to go: The camp takes place on the CONSOL Energy Park field, located just off Interstate 70. Take Exit 15 (Chestnut Street exit) and bear right off the exit ramp onto Route 40 East. Turn right at the next light into Washington Crown Center. Make another right immediately after and follow road to its end. The park is located straight ahead.

What to Bring: Campers should bring their own gloves, bats and helmets. They should be dressed in athletic attire. Sweatpants or baseball pants are preferable, and spikes are the desired footwear. Each camper will also get their own t-shirt included with the camp fee. Please note that all participants are responsible for their own belongings.

When it Takes Place: The camp will occur on August 12, 13, 14 and 15 for 1 hour each day. Players ages 12, 13 and 14 will participate from 11:00 to 12:00 and 9, 10 and 11 year olds will play from 12:00 to 1:00 PM Each time slot can only fit 15 participants, as there will be at least one Wild Things player per five campers- make sure you sign up right away to get a spot!
