# TOM VAETH | MANAGER

Tom Vaeth enters his third season as the field manager of the Washington Wild Things in 2023. It's Vaeth's first managerial job in pro baseball, but he has managed in the California Winter League and on an interim basis during his tenure with the American Association's Winnipeg Goldeyes. He was named the 10th manager in Wild Things' history January 6, 2021.

Previous managers are Jeff Isom (2002-03), John Massarelli (2004-07), Greg Jelks (2008), Mark Mason (2009), Darin Everson (2010-11), Chris Bando (2012), Bart Zeller (2013-14), Bob Bozzuto (2014-15) and Gregg Langbehn (2016-20). Vaeth, when he was honored as the Roger Hanners Award winner in 2022 for Frontier League Manager of the Year, became the third skipper of the club to receive the honor, joining Isom (2002) and Massarelli (2004, 2006) in that department.

The Baltimore, Maryland, native spent 17 seasons as an assistant with the Goldeyes. He worked in player procurement and as base coach, hitting coach and bullpen coach. During his tenure with the club, Winnipeg made the playoffs 10 times and won three championships. He spent most of his time there as the hitting coach with his teams finishing top five in their leagues more than 10 times.

Before getting the Wild Things' job, he narrowly missed out on the same job with the Cleburne Railroaders (American Association) prior to the 2019 season. A back-end, last-minute deal took that job from him and he was also considered for the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs (Atlantic League) job prior to that 2019 campaign.

A catcher as a player, Vaeth played two seasons of JuCo ball before an injury derailed his playing career. He'd go on to spend four years in scouting between the Marlins and Padres. Vaeth worked for Orioles for five seasons, partly as an ambidextrous batting practice pitcher. He's also gained coaching experience at the JuCo and DI levels as well (Towson included).

He replaced Gregg Langbehn, who was with the team from 2016-2020; Langbehn retired from pro ball and left as Washington's second most tenured manager, seventh in Frontier League managerial wins (he's been passed for that position since). Gregg guided Washington to two playoff appearances, an FLCS appearance and the 2018 East Division title (team's first division crown since 2007). He directed an MVP, Pitcher of the Year, Citizenship Award Winner, 21 All Stars and saw eight players' contract get purchased.

Alex Boshers enters his third season as the pitching coach of the Washington Wild Things and his third as a pro baseball coach overall in 2023. A prep star in Nashville, he pitched collegiately at Tennessee-Martin before playing seven seasons of professional baseball including pitching in 15 regular-season games for Wild Things in 2021 as a player-coach. The previous six seasons of pro ball were spent in the American Association plus he had a two-game stint in the Atlantic League with the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs. He was 40-34 with a 4.72 ERA in 609.2 pro innings pitched and also played in Nicaragua and Australia professionally. He's also a baseball instructor during the offseason and has worked with travel baseball organizations.

He was the recipient of the 2021 Darren Bush Award in the Frontier League for Coach of the Year. He and his wife Megan (White), who works as a physical therapist, reside in New Albany, Ohio.

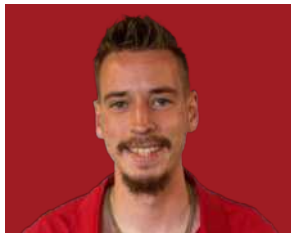

He played from 2020-22 at Willamette University. Ryan had a brief run with the Paddleheads in the Pioneer League while he was serving as an assistant coach in 2022 and he's also an assistant at Chaffey College in Rancho Cucamonga, California.

# #1 STEPHEN KNAPP | RIGHT-HANDED PITCHER

The 2023 season is Stephen Knapp's third professional season and his second with the Washington Wild Things. In 2022, Knapp came to Washington after being released by the Quebec Capitales. He appeared in 10 games for the Capitales last season, one of which was a start, and was 1-1 in 10.1 innings. He allowed 14 hits and had an 8.71 ERA with three homers allowed. Once with Washington, he started nine of the 13 games he appeared in. He was 4-3 with the Wild Things and in 50 innings, struck out 33 to 11 walks with a 3.42 ERA. Knapp was the starter for the 1,000th win in Wild Things' history against the Gateway Grizzlies in Sauget in August. He earned the win in that contest.

Previous to 2022, Knapp pitched for Equipe Quebec in the Frontier League in 2021 and was 1-1 with a 2.37 ERA in 26 regular-season appearances (three starts). In 38 innings, Knapp allowed 33 hits, 13 runs (10 earned), nine walks and 26 strikeouts.

During the 2020 summer, Knapp pitched for the Road Warrior Black Sox in Washington's COVID pod. He posted a 1.35 ERA in 6.2 innings across six appearances. He allowed seven hits and one run with two strikeouts and a save.

His college career saw him play at two schools, first at Golden West College. He pitched two seasons there. As a sophomore, the righty appeared in 15 games, 12 of which were starts, and pitched his way to a 6-5 record with a 4.40 ERA and a pair of saves. He fanned 60 batters in 75.2 innings and owned a career 4.41 ERA and 65:16 K:BB ratio at GWC. After those seasons, Knapp pitched two seasons at Bellevue University (NAIA). In 2018, he was 1st Team All-NSAA and was 5-3 with a 2.90 ERA in 15 games (14 starts). In 80.2 innings, Knapp walked only 17 and struck out 67. In 2019, he was 10-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 15 starts. He had eight complete games across 101 innings with 54 strikeouts and 15 walks. He posted five shutouts.

At Edison High School, he hit .360 with three extra-base hits and 25 RBI as a senior while pitching 20 innings on the mound.

Kobe Foster is set for his 2nd pro season (first full season) after joining the Wild Things in June of 2022. Foster was 8-1 in 11 games (10 starts) for the Wild Things last season and set the new franchise single-season record for ERA with an even 1.00 earned run average, surpassing the previous record of 1.29 in 2019 by Zach Strecker, the Frontier League's all-time career saves leader. Foster threw 63 innings and allowed 44 hits, eight runs, seven of which were earned, one home run and struck out 51 to 15 walks. He was named the Frontier League's Jason Simontacchi Award winner for Rookie of the Year at the end of the season, becoming the third Wild Thing to receive the honor (Casey Barnes, 2011; Ryan Hennen, 2021).

The southpaw prepped at Huntland High School and was selected to the TBCA All-State team in 2015. He finished his high school career on the mound with 161 strikeouts in 109.1 innings with a 1.34 ERA. The Tennessee native then played two seasons at Motlow State Community College. As a freshman he appeared in 18 games (eight starts) and was 8-2 with four saves and in 66.2 innings, opponents hit just .248 against him. He had 101 strikeouts to just 24 walks that season and a 4.72 ERA. Things got a lot better the next year, as Foster was NJCAA Pitcher of the Week and TCCAA First-Team as a result of 12 games seeing him go 8-2 with a 1.61 ERA in 75.1 innings of work. He fanned 102 batters and walked only 16 while posting an opponent batting average of .143.

He transferred to Tennessee Wesleyan for the next three seasons. The lefty pitched in three games in 2020 before the season was cut short by COVID-19. In 2021, Foster was 12-0 with a 1.83 ERA in 15 games (14 starts) for TWU and had a complete game. In 88.1 innings, he punched out 106 and walked 12 with just 58 hits allowed and 20 runs (18 earned). In 2022 at TWU, he was 13-1 with a 1.42 ERA in 15 games, all starts. He threw 101.1 innings, allowed 57 hits, walked 24 and fanned 139 before coming to Washington.

Scotty enters his third season with the Wild Things in 2023 after posting an All-Star season in 2022. Dubrule slashed .317/.413/.403 with 22 doubles, two homers and 47 RBI in 2022 with 55 walks drawn and 21 stolen bases. He was one of nine Washington mid-season Frontier League All Stars.

The 2022 season followed a great start to his professional career with Washington in 2021. He had a 31-game on-base streak that season to start his pro career that was snapped Sunday, August 22, 2021. The 0-4 that day also snapped a 15-game hit streak. He had two 15-game hit streaks to go along with his efforts and ended the season on a 17-game on-base streak. Dubrule finished 40 plate appearances shy of qualifying for the league leaders, or else he'd have had a great chance with lead the league in batting average and on-base percentage, where he finished at .374 and .461, respectively. In 51 games, he accumulated 220 plate appearances, scored 35 times, posted 10 doubles, a triple and a home run and drove in 21 with 31 walks to 21 strikeouts.

Dubrule finished his collegiate career at Mississippi State and helped the Bulldogs win a national title by hitting .278 as the primary second baseman. He drove in 31 and had 62 hits in 223 at bats with an OBP of .384. He hit six doubles and only made three errors. He'd entered the year 2nd active in the NCAA in career hits with 249 after starting 194 of 197 career appearances at Jacksonville University, where he was a two-time All-Conference selection, tabbed 2nd Team All-ASUN as a junior and first team as a sophomore. He led the ASUN and finished No. 6 nationally with 29 hits in 2020. Scotty also carried a 13-game hit streak and reached in 16 of 18 games that season.

He lettered all four years at Venice High School and was a team captain as a senior and won a state title as a junior. He was three-time All-Area, All-State and All-American as a senior by Sports Wire. He owns school records for consecutive hits [16], career hits [137] and career BA [.405].

His brother Kevin just graduated from Army West Point, where he was a two-time Patriot League first teamer, and was named Patriot League Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year in 2023. Kevin became the first in program history to win both of those awards in the same season by slashing .399/.440/.601 with seven homers, 58 RBI and 17 doubles with just 11 strikeouts in 49 games. His other brother David is committed to play at Army.

Lagrange is in his second season with the Wild Things and in indy ball in 2023 after a very successful 2022 campaign with Washington. He matched the single-season hit record set by Lance Koenig in 2005 with 125 hits and slashed .346/.396/.490... a batting average that was good for fifth in the Frontier League. His 27 doubles were sixth in the league and paced the Wild Things to a team record 168 doubles last season. He also had two triples, seven homers and 62 RBI, a total that led the club (sans Anthony Brocato's 76, only 10 of which came with Washington). Wagner posted 40 multi-hit games and a team-leading 17 of which were at least three-hit nights. He also had 16 multi-RBI games, which was the highest total on the team. Lagrange was a 2022 Frontier League midseason All Star.

This past offseason, Wagner was a part of a winter-ball championship-winning club in the Mexican Pacific Winter League.

Prior to coming to Washington, Lagrange spent six seasons in the New York Mets organization after signing with the club as an international free agent in 2015. He reached as high as Triple-A Syracuse (2021). He also played for Double-A Binghamton in 2021. In 411 career MiLB games, Lagrange hit 20 homers, drove in 209 and slashed .291/.346/.399. That work at the dish spanned 1,704 plate appearances and he had 83 doubles as a Mets' farmhand.

He played at Sergia Mateo High School in the D.R.

Brocato is in the midst of his first full season with the Washington Wild Things after being acquired in a trade in August of 2022 for a player to be named [ended up being Cole Brannen] with the Florence Y'alls. In 2022, he slashed .300/.369/.617 with 19 doubles, 24 homers and 76 RBI. With Washington in 2022, he played in 10 games and hit two homers with 10 RBI. He was a 2022 Frontier League Midseason All Star.

Brocato played his high school ball at Rutgers Prep and was a four-year letterwinner for the Argonauts. He hit .617 with 10 home runs and 35 RBI as a senior to earn first team Louisville Slugger High School All-America honors, a second-team All-USA HS Baseball selection and was the Star-Ledger New Jersey Player of the Year as a senior. He was two-time all-state, two-time first-team All-Somerset County, two-time first team All-Non Public, 2014 2nd Team Perfect Game Preseason All-Northeast Region and a second team Louisville Slugger HS All-American. Plus he was county player of the year as a junior.

The outfielder was a unanimous All-BIG EAST selection [First Team] at St John's in 2017 as a junior [led team in RBI and HR], 2nd-Team All-BIG EAST in 2018 as a senior [led team in homers again]

He played in 39 games at St. John's as a freshman and drove in 11 with a .296 batting average, As a sophomore in 2016, he played in 41 games and hit .272 with a homer and 11 RBI. Brocato exploded on the scene in a breakout junior season, where he hit .317/.400/.550 with 16 doubles, a triple, eight homers and 47 RBI with 19 walks to 29 strikeouts and then played in 55 games, a career high, in 2018. He had nine doubles and 11 homers with 38 RBI and a .244/.318/.461 slash line that season.

He Spent 2015 summer with Keene in the NECL and slugged four home runs before playing in the Northwoods League in 2016 with Thunder Bay and hitting eight doubles, a triple and nine home runs and 33 RBI.

Brocato started pro career in 2019 with Southern Illinois [Miners] and was 16-for-40 at the dish with two doubles, two triples, two homers and 10 RBI and then spent 2021 with the Miners. He slashed .273/.343/.513 with 19 doubles, 2 triples, 17 home runs and 60 RBI.

# 2022 SEASON IN REVIEW

**2022 IN REVIEW:** The Washington Wild Things, in their 20th season of Frontier League baseball, amassed 62 wins, the second best win total in the history of the organization (63 wins in the 2005 season). The club surpassed 1,000 wins as an organization (see below). The Wild Things won the eighth division title in franchise history, capturing the West Division crown August 30 after taking over first-place and never falling back again June 21. On the mound, Washington was tied for fourth in ERA (.408). As a team, Washington finished fourth in BA (.284), third in OBP (.371) and fifth in slugging (.441). In the field, the unit was second in fewest errors made (68) and fielding percentage (.981). The team won 10-straight series between the 3rd and 13th series of the season, which started with a three-game sweep of the Empire State Greys and finished with a sweep of the Lake Erie Crushers. The streak came to an end with a series loss against the Windy City Thunder-Bolts from June 24-26 in Crestwood. That was immediately followed by a sweep and then two more series victories. Beginning with the series before the break in Evansville, the club rattled off another nine-series win streak and ended the season winners of six in a row. Washington entered the playoffs as the West Division champ and was knocked off 2-0 in the best of three FLDS against the Schaumburg Boomers, who went on to finish runner up to the Québec Capitales.

**SETTING THE BAR:** Shortstop Nick Ward finished third in the league in batting average, first in OBP (.478), fifth in slugging percentage (.620), fifth in walks drawn and was one of 15 players in the league with 19 or more home runs (19). Wagner Lagrange finished sixth in the league in doubles with 27 while Anthony Brocato (acquired from Florence in August) hit two of his 24 homers with Washington, a total tied for sixth in the league. He also finished with 76 RBI (10 in 10 games with the Wild Things). Rob Whalen finished tied for first in the league in wins with 12 after missing three weeks and was eighth in ERA (3.50). Sandro Cabrera was 7th in ERA at 3.42. Lukas Young finished tied for second in saves with 20. As a team, the club set a new single-season record for doubles with 168. Individually, Lagrange matched the single-season hits record with 125 (Lance Koenig, 125, 2005) while Kobe Foster set the new single-season ERA record with a 1.00 ERA, passing Zach Strecker's 1.29 in 2019. Hector Roa became the franchise's home run king and Nick Ward's .478 OBP is the new single-season record for the team. He set the OPS record as well at 1.098.

**THE GOLD STANDARD:** The Wild Things took home four awards as an organization when the Frontier League announced its postseason awards for the 2022 season. Shortstop Nick Ward, following his tremendous season, was selected as the league's postseason All Star SS, while Kobe Foster became the second-straight Jason Simontacchi Award winner as Rookie of the Year. He became the third Wild Thing to win the award, joining Casey Barnes (2011) and Ryan Hennen (2021) in that department. Tom Vaeth took home Manager of the Year honors, becoming the third skipper in team history to take home the award. The Wild Things were also honored as Organization of the Year for efforts in theme nights, promotions, programs like the Senior Slugger and Kids Eat Free programs, plus the hosting of the All-Star festivities and Celebrity Softball games. It was the fourth time the team received that honor (2002, 2004 - Tie with Kalamazoo, 2005 - East, Tie with Florence).

**NEXT LEVEL THINGS:** The Wild Things sent two players to affiliated ball following the season: Nick Ward to the Philadelphia Phillies' organization and Jake Pilarski to the Los Angeles Dodgers' organization. The team nearly had two more during the campaign, but purchases were nullified for various reasons. Entering the 2023 MiLB season, nine former Wild Things are in affiliated ball. Sean Kealey (Springfield Cardinals - AA, STL), Ward (Jersey Shore BlueClaws - A+, PHI), James Meeker (Biloxi Shuckers - AA, MIL), Austin Kitchen (Hartford Yard Goats - AA, COL), Joe Campagna (ACL Rockies - Rk, COL), Jake Pilarski (Great Lakes Loons - A+, LAD), Spencer Bivens (Eugene Emeralds - A+, SF), Ryan Hennen (Delmarva Shorebirds - A+, BAL) and John Murphy (Daytona Tortugas - A, CIN) are the nine. Their teams listed are where they were on Opening Day of the minor league campaign.

**JOURNEY TO 1,000 VICTORIES:** Washington won its 1,000th game Friday, August 12, 2022 in the series opener against the Gateway Grizzlies in Sauget, Illinois. The win, a 6-4 victory, made the Wild Things the fourth team joining Evansville (in 27th season), Windy City (in 23rd season) and River City (Rascals, played 21 seasons and left the league after 2019) in the 1,000-win club in the Frontier League. Washington is the fastest team to the mark in league history.

**JACOB DEMPSEY INDUCTED INTO FL HALL:** Jacob Dempsey entered the Frontier League Hall of Fame July 20 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the ASG. Dempsey was a tremendous RBI man for Washington from 2008-2010. In his 257 games, he had 221 RBI. Almost half of his 264 hits went for extra bases. He was named to the FL PS All-Star team as the DH in both 2008 and 2009.

**FRANCHISE RECORD NINE REPRESENT WASHINGTON IN ASG:** Nine Wild Things played on the West Division All-Star Team this season, which set a new franchise record, surpassing the previous mark of eight set in 2018 when the ASG was Rookies vs Experienced in River City (O'Fallon, MO). SS Nick Ward and OF Wagner Lagrange were voted in as starters and ended up being joined by RHP Rob Whalen (manager's choice) and 1B Andrew Czech (injury replacement) in the lineup. Czech and Whalen had already been voted in as pitcher and reserve, along with Lukas Young as a pitcher and Ian Walters, Alex Alvarez, Scotty Dubrule (manager's addition) and Cole Brannen (injury replacement) as reserves. Tom Vaeth and Alex Boshers were on the West staff while Austin Pascarella served as the West athletic trainer for the event, hosted by the Wild Things.

## 2023 ROSTER RULES

**Active Roster:** 22 players minimum, 24 max

**Offseason:** Carry no more than 34 players (no classification limit) - Players signed out of Cal Winter League don't count toward the 34-player limit.

**Rookie:** Each club must carry a minimum of 10 rookies (combined R1 and R2 -- R1's are in their pro debut seasons or XP that doesn't meet the requirements for a full season (75 at bats, 15 games pitched or 30 innings pitched)... R2's are in their second pro season by those qualifications

**Experienced:** Each Club can carry a max of 14 Es/VETs (no more than four can be veterans) -- E's are in at least their third season... The Veteran classification is for a player over 29 years of age prior to October 1 of that playing season... for the 2023 season, any player born on or before 9/30/94 is a VET no matter their playing experience in pro ball

**21-Year Old Exemption:** Any player who is 21 years of age or younger on or after October 1 of any season and is entering his first year in the league, regardless of any other playing experience in pro ball, will be considered no higher than an R-2

**Military Exemption:** Players who served on active military duty will receive an exemption to the age limit to avoid veteran status of one year for each year of active duty

**Position Change Exemption:** Starting with 2016, position players who are switching to pitching and pitchers switching to a position will have their classifications reset to R2 provided they do not appear in any games at their previous position

**Injured List Limits:** Teams can have a maximum of one player on the 7-Day IL and two on the 14-Day IL. There is no limit on players to the 60-Day IL

**Inactive List:** Players must be on the inactive list for a minimum of 14 days before they can be activated

## BROADCAST TEAM



The 2023 season will be Kyle's 8th full season with the Washington Wild Things. He is the team's play-by-play broadcaster and now the assistant general manager of baseball operations, a title announced February 11, 2022.

A native of Plum, Pennsylvania, Kyle played high school baseball for the Mustangs before heading to Waynesburg University and into the school's Department of Communication. At WU, he served in a multitude of roles including serving as the producer and as a broadcaster for the Waynesburg University Sports Network, general manager of WCYJ-FM, the school's student radio station, sports director for WCTV, the school's TV station and assistant sports editor for The Yellow Jacket, the school's newspaper.

He began his tenure with the Wild Things in 2015 as an official scorer and scoreboard operator before serving as the emcee the next year as an intern. He was the Community Relations and Social Media Manager in 2017, running in-game entertainment and social media as well as media relations, before taking over the role of Media Relations Manager and Broadcaster in 2018. He was the broadcaster and handled media relations again in 2019, before returning to the office in 2020 prior to pod play as a ticket sales rep and broadcaster.

In 2019 and 2021, Kyle was selected as the Frontier League's Robert Ford Award winner for the league's Broadcaster of the Year.

Outside of Wild Things Park, Kyle is a broadcaster for the TribLIVE High School Sports Network, covering several WPIAL sports. Additionally, he is an avid Pirates, Steelers, Penguins and Pitt fan. You can find him spending time with friends, watching his favorite TV shows, from Breaking Bad and Better Call Saul to The West Wing, The Wire, Peaky Blinders, The Sopranos, Stranger Things and Grey's Anatomy. Logan is a producer and host as well as a play-by-play announcer at Waynesburg University and wrote for Sportsvival Draft as an NFL writer in Fantasy Football. He's expected to graduate Waynesburg in the spring of 2024.
